SnowSchool in the Eastern Sierra



SnowSchool is a bridge connecting kids to snow science, watersheds and winter recreation. This Winter Wildlands Alliance program is a STEM-based curriculum that combines a field trip in the snow with classroom presentations. Students learn about hydrology, winter ecology, wildlife, and snow crystals. They also make a vital connection between the snowpack—source of more than 80% of our water in the WestWe need your help! Manzanar National Historic Site News

War Relocation Authority Building Relocated back to Manzanar



We are proud to say the first piece of the administration staff apartment building made it back to Manzanar from Lone Pine. This original Manzanar staff apartment building will be returned to its original location in Manzanar's administration area, where the War Relocation Authority (WRA) staff and their families (historically referred to as "Caucasian" staff) lived and worked. During the war, some referred to the staff housing area as "Beverly Hills" since both the buildings and the people were "white."

This will provide the only example of living conditions for the WRA staff that can be contrasted to the living conditions of the incarcerees. Beyond serving as a visual and physical contrast, having a staff building will allow Manzanar to expand its interpretation of the WRA staff and their role in trying to reconcile the directives from the national WRA headquarters in Washington DC with the realities of a forcibly incarcerated community.

Photo was taken by Tim Walden who was instrumental in getting the building donated to the NPS by the owners, Christine and Marvin Hedrics. ESIA mitigated the building from any contaminants like asbestos, lead and mold. West Coast Barns & Sheds did the move. A huge thank you to the many generous people who donated to ESIA to support this project.

Updates from the 'Hills



The Alabama Hills just celebrated it's 4th birthday as a National Scenic Area!

ESIA has been working alongside the Bureau of Land Management to continue restoration efforts and education in the Alabama Hills. Learn more about these changes on our website.
